





Rationale for survey





Throughout the school year, the school undertakes a range of surveys to seek the views of parents and pupils. Staff and governors are committed to engaging with parents in order to build excellent relations that continue to improve our school still further.

This particular survey is based on OFSTED's Parent View questions which are available for completion on-line as a link from the school website. As previously, Governors used Open Evening as an opportunity to encourage parents to complete the survey in paper form.

Results

A total of 90 surveys were completed (an increase on previous years), results were then collated and are available below.





Comments included:

My child receives appropriate homework for their age:

- Give them more
- Too much at times
- ...sometimes there appears to be no relation between the maths set and what has been taught in class and so I get concerned that I may be teaching him incorrectly...
Very little maths homework

The school makes sure its pupils behave well

- Most of the time

The school deals effectively with bullying

- Could be better

I receive valuable information about my child's progress

- Lots of PA info about events, less communication about academic development during the term

Discussion points

This year's results were again overwhelmingly positive providing further assurance to the Governing Body regarding the high level of parental satisfaction with our school.

The numbers of negative responses for any individual statement were very small and would not suggest that any significant changes are necessary but all feedback is valued.

As in previous years the question about homework generated widely varying comments. The Homework policy will be reviewed this term and any changes will be communicated to parents by Mrs Waterfield and the Class Teachers.

The percentage of parents who do not feel the school deals effectively with bullying - although very small - has increased slightly from the previous survey and we would urge any parent who is concerned about this issue to contact the Class teacher and Mrs Waterfield.

Governors were pleased to note an increase in the percentage of parents who felt they receive valuable information about their child's progress from 94% in our last survey to 98% this year. Any parent who feels they have not received adequate information through parents evenings should make an appointment with the Class teacher or Head teacher.
